Community Engagement at Praxair

Employee volunteerism is the backbone of our community engagement program. Our programs are global in scope and benefit hundreds of thousands. In 2013:

- 221 Praxair sites around the world participated in community engagement projects, a 33 percent increase over 2012.
- Employees participated in 202 global projects, engaged in 14,586 individual instances of volunteerism and amassed approximately 63,000 service hours.

Most importantly, these efforts positively affected the lives of those in our communities.

 Community engagement projects benefitted more than 326,000 people globally — that is more than 12 beneficiaries for every Praxair employee. In addition to volunteering, community engagement efforts are supported by Praxair's Global Giving Program through the funding of employee volunteer grants. Our facilities and employees also directly contributed approximately \$1.5 million in monetary and in-kind support through our community engagement efforts.

Our community engagement projects result in a variety of benefits for many stakeholders. Some projects, for example, directly impact basic needs while others build long-term skills. Praxair continues to measure the results of our community engagement efforts using a methodology developed by the London Benchmarking Group. Key metrics are assessed for each project, and highlights of some outcome measurements are included below.


The Community Engagement Awards*


Praxair recognizes excellence in community engagement efforts through the annual Community Engagement Awards program.

Four global winners and a Chairman's Award are presented at Praxair's Global Leadership Conference in January of each year.





Project Focus: Healthcare

The Need

It is estimated that one person dies from heart disease in Canada every seven minutes.

The Response

For the second consecutive year, 30 employees from Praxair's Mississauga office participated in the Heart and Stroke Foundation's Big Bike fundraiser by riding together on a bicycle built for 30! Funds from this event are used to support vital heart and stroke research, as well as the Foundation's health promotion and advocacy programs. As a major supplier of home medical equipment, Praxair Canada's participation in this event is another

illustration of the company's commitment to promoting health and wellness for both its employees and local Mississauga communities.

Project Focus: Education

The Need

In the United States, there is a critical need for improved science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) education, especially in underserved innercity schools.

The Response

In 2009, the Praxair Technology Center (PTC) and the State University of New York at Buffalo partnered to create the Buffalo Public Schools Interdisciplinary Science and Engineering Program (ISEP). This National Science Foundation-funded program was designed to improve STEM education in Buffalo middle and high schools through a combination of in-class education, hands-on instruction and summer research projects for teachers. The PTC has supported an after-school science club and offered

summer internships to Buffalo public school teachers to participate in research with Praxair R&D associates. These teachers take their experiences back to the classrooms and integrate them into the curriculum.

providing teachers with summer internships that allow them to work with researchers and equipment not typically available to them. These teachers develop new concepts to use in the classroom and learn how to demonstrate real-world applications of these concepts to their students. The program's primary goal is to increase the number of students entering STEM fields.

CDI Comunidade White Martins

Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

White Martins' Fábrica de Equipamentos Criogênicos (FEC) plant is located in the Cordovil neighborhood of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, one of the poorest neighborhoods in the city. Residents of the area lack access to information technology and civics resources, and youth spend much of their idle time on the streets.

The Response

FEC employees partnered with the Residents Association of the Cordovil Slum, nearby public schools and the Committee for the Democratization of Information Technology (CDI) to launch the School for Computer Training and Civics in 2005. The School, located on Praxair's property, provides both teens and adult students

with basic computer and citizenship skills. Though the CDI operates similar schools in the Rio de Janeiro area, few companies host these schools on their own premises. The school provides a safe haven for both children and adults and helps them develop needed skills. Classes consisting of lectures, debates and role-playing exercises are held twice a week and each course runs for three months. Students graduate with a certificate of completion for employment.

reducing social inequalities. The school fosters positive societal change by teaching students communications technologies and other crucial job skills.

"The Computer and Citizenship School Project was founded in 2005 inside our cryogenic equipment plant. The strong commitment of the employees is a crucial reason the project continues to exist and has recently reached the milestone of 1,000 student graduates, which makes all of us in White Martins very proud. The project seeks to provide key skills and computer education to students in our local communities, as well as instill in them a sense of civic pride."

Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

Many children from low-income families not only have limited access to basic life necessities, but also have few opportunities to participate in leisure activities and engage in cultural enrichment.

The Response

In August 2013, employees and family members at Praxair's facility in Taiwan partnered with the World Peace League to organize a museum trip for low-income families. The League improves the lives of low-income children by working with partners who provide funds for their care. Praxair has worked with this organization for several years providing meals to children. But the employees wanted to make a more direct connection with the children, so they

organized a family day. Each child was paired with a Praxair employee or family and spent a fun and enriching day touring a museum and going to a 3D movie. Not only did the employees and children enjoy the event, but they also learned a lot about each other.

Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

South Bend's Near Northwest
Neighborhood is an urban area in need of
renewal. Abandoned and vacant homes
and empty, trash-filled lots are a concern to
many residents, as is overall safety. There
is also a need for stronger relationships
between residents and police and other
government officials as they all work to
improve the neighborhood.

The Response

Praxair Distribution, Inc. (PDI) employees volunteered at the first-ever neighborhood block party sponsored by Lots of Hope, a nonprofit organization founded by PDI Sales and Marketing Specialist Nancy Tetzlaff. Its goal is to transform vacant lots in the Near Northwest Neighborhood from eyesores into gardens, playgrounds and

green spaces. The block party was an opportunity for neighborhood residents to get to know each other, strengthen important relationships with local public safety and government officials, as well as Lots of Hope representatives. This fun and open atmosphere encouraged greater collaboration and generated ideas for improving the neighborhood. In addition, through Praxair's Global Giving Program, ten neighborhood children were provided funds to attend summer camp at a local community center.

Making our Planet More Productive by building better neighborhoods in order to build a better world. Transforming five vacant lots in the Near Northwest Neighborhood is a first step toward that goal.

Project Focus: Environment

The Need

We all depend on our planet's finite store of natural resources, which are increasingly under stress from population growth and continued development.

The Response

Praxair Canada hosted an earth-friendly competition across all of its business groups during Earth Week 2013. Employees participated in a variety of projects, including: shoreline clean-up, waste removal at Praxair facilities and in nearby parks and schools, recycling programs, bike riding to work initiatives, an Earth Week logo competition and increased efforts to reduce paper and energy consumption. Employees also planted 175 trees as part of Mississauga's One Million Trees project

and released young hatchery-raised white sturgeon into the Columbia River through the Upper Columbia White Sturgeon Recovery Initiative. The events were such a success last year that employee participation more than doubled in 2013. In addition, for each employee and business location that participated in Earth Week, Praxair Canada made a donation to the United Way, raising a total of \$8,530.

Feed My Starving Children

Project Focus: Healthcare

The Need

Hunger and malnutrition are global concerns, especially in underdeveloped countries.

The Response

Employees from Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota, partnered with Feed My Starving Children (FMSC), a nonprofit organization that provides healthy meals to children worldwide. The organization has provided over 153 million meals, helping to alleviate hunger and malnutrition for children in underdeveloped regions in approximately 70 countries. Praxair's Central Region Safety Leadership Team organized a project in which 16 employees joined volunteers from other organizations to package healthy meals containing rice, vegetables and

vitamins. In just one hour, the volunteers packaged enough meals to feed 70 children for one year.

Making our Planet More Productive by providing children with the daily vitamins and nutrients they need to grow healthy and strong.

"This organization has partnered with scientists from several large food companies to develop standard meal packages to fulfill comprehensive nutrition needs for people in developing countries. In 2012, over 660,000 volunteers packaged 153 million meals. FMSC ensures that the food is safely distributed to those in need. While it feeds the nutritional needs of starving people, it also feeds the spirits of its volunteers."

Project Focus: Healthcare

The Need

The area near the Praxair Surface Technologies (PST) location in Coimbatore, India, is economically disadvantaged. Many of the local residents cannot afford to visit eye doctors or receive needed treatment, including surgery.

The Response

In collaboration with the Aravind Eye Hospital, PST employees sponsored a free event that provided medical vision services for the local community. The clinic offered free eye exams and replacement eyeglasses at a minimal cost. The project also provided free cataract surgeries to several patients. In total, the project benefitted 300 people. All of the site's employees participated in the effort and visited with each surgery patient.

In addition to providing eye care services, employees also distributed food and clothing to many of the patients as well as to children at a local orphanage.

Hands Across Europe

Project Focus: Healthcare

The Need

Cancer is one of the leading causes of death in Europe, affecting people across the continent.

The Response

Several Praxair Europe locations joined together to develop "Hands Across Europe — United in the Fight Against Cancer," a pan-European program to raise money for cancer research and treatment. Working with teams in each of its businesses, Praxair Europe decided to support local cancer organizations that focus on research into possible cures, have programs that help children suffering from the disease, or provide support to cancer patients and their families. Employee efforts included: fundraising to support research, a coffee

cup sale to support cancer organizations and hospitals, a blood drive and participation in a "Race for the Cure" event. Hands Across Europe benefitted cancer research organizations in six European countries and plans are already in place to continue the program into the future.



Project Focus: Diversity

The Need

Adults and children with mental disabilities often lack opportunities to take part in organized physical fitness programs and events, to regularly socialize with others in their communities and to develop new skills.

The Response

At the 2013 World Winter Games in Pyeongchang, 27 Praxair Korea employees and their families helped U.S. Special Olympians create hanji art. Hanji is a traditional type of Korean paper made from the country's native mulberry tree. The volunteers taught the athletes about hanji and how to cut and paste it into beautiful art, without using paint or a brush. This event

gave the athletes a better understanding of Korean culture and helped them improve their socialization skills.

Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

Homeless children worldwide are at greater risk to succumb to harmful influences such as drugs and juvenile delinguency.

The Response

Employees at the White Martins Copesul plant joined a communitywide challenge to sell 25,000 roasted chicken dinners to benefit Casa Alberta, a local youth shelter focused on educating and advocating for at-risk youth. The shelter does not have many permanent volunteers and needed community support to help these children become contributing members of society. Praxair volunteers stepped in and reached out to business, civic, religious and military groups to sell these Happy Half Chicken meals. The funds raised were used to build

a new headquarters for the shelter and purchase needed supplies.

Making our Planet More Productive by providing a safe environment in which children can learn and grow free from harmful influences.

Project Focus: Healthcare

The Need

In Mexico, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease is the sixth leading cause of death and more than 20 million people in the country have been diagnosed with this condition. Mexico also ranks first worldwide in obesity, while in Costa Rica, 21 percent of children are overweight.

The Response

Praxair Mexico's Monterrey office organized a program to help elementary school children in low-income areas who were suffering from respiratory diseases. The employees focused on increasing the children's access to medical attention and promoting physical activity. Praxair Mexico donated a dozen medical products to children in need and arranged special

pricing for local nonprofit organizations that provide such products to low-income families. Working with several local health and education organizations, Praxair also launched programs at 46 elementary schools located near company sites in Mexico and Costa Rica. In addition, many Praxair employees volunteered at these schools, helping to promote the benefits of healthy eating and exercise.

Project Focus: Disaster Relief

The Need

Many Connecticut residents were displaced from their homes due to severe flooding resulting from Hurricane Sandy. Many of those affected were housed in shelters without any of their personal belongings.

The Response

Employees at Praxair's corporate headquarters in Danbury, Connecticut hosted a drive to provide grooming necessities to shelters assisting local victims of Hurricane Sandy. Over 60 "care kits" containing towels, washcloths, toiletries and bandages were donated to Heart to Heart International, a global organization that provides medical education, delivers medical aid and assists communities in crisis.

Project Focus: Disaster Relief

The Need

Many people in New Jersey suffered significant devastation due to Hurricane Sandy. They lost friends and family, homes, personal belongings and, in some cases, everything they owned.

The Response

In the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy, employees at the Praxair Chicago Center (PCC) collected almost 700 pounds of clothing, food, blankets and other items critical to recovery. Through the Community Food Bank of New Jersey, this food and clothing was distributed to residents who had suffered losses during the hurricane. More than 200 adults and children were

provided with provisions to help them rebuild their lives.

Karner Blue Butterfly Project

Praxair Surface Technologies - Concord, NH

Project Focus: Environment

The Need

The population of the Karner blue butterfly declined from 3,000 in 1983 to fewer than 100 by 1994. The decline was primarily caused by the loss of wild blue lupine, a food source for the developing caterpillars.

The Response

Part of the Praxair Surface Technologies (PST) property in Concord, New Hampshire, is the last known location in the Northeast of the federally endangered Karner blue butterfly. PST employees partnered with the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department to take a proactive role in restoring the butterfly population on its land. PST employees cleared timber and brush and planted over 600 native lupine and other nectar plants, which serve as food sources

for the butterflies. Praxair's Global Giving Program also provided funds to purchase lupine plants for Concord schoolchildren as part of the "Kids for Karners" program. As the program continues, PST employees hope to plant up to 15 acres of lupine in order to restore the butterflies' habitat and eventually increase the population of the species.

Making our Planet More Productive by working to increase the population of an endangered species and the ecosystem on which it depends.

"The amount of work that was completed by Praxair in such a short period would have taken a week or more for our limited staff to complete. The plantings doubled the amount of existing habitat, which will support the butterflies that are released from the captive breeding program."

Project Focus: Disaster Relief

The Need

In April 2013, a 7.0 magnitude earthquake hit the Ya'an Sichuan province, a mountainous area in China. More than 400,000 people were impacted by the earthquake, including thousands of children who lost their homes and schools.

The Response

The Praxair China Social Club organized a relief effort for children affected by the earthquake, helping them return to school with necessary supplies and helping restore a level of normalcy to their lives. The club raised \$20,000 through employee donations from all Praxair China sites as part of a matching gift program. The employees used the funds to purchase 1,500 sets of school bags, raincoats, pencil boxes, safety caps

and stationery, which they delivered to children in the impacted area.

Project Focus: Environment

The Need

Rapid growth of invasive plant species threatens the natural environment of public lands. In many cases, environmental organizations do not have the necessary resources to maintain these areas, leaving the invasive plants to thrive.

The Response

Employees in Praxair's Leadership Technical Orientation Program (LTOP), Hydrogen Technical Orientation Program (HyTOP) and Praxair Distribution, Inc.'s (PDI) developmental programs, participate in a community engagement activity each time they meet as a group. For one such project, the group volunteered with the Nature Consortium in Seattle, Washington. The Consortium is a grassroots, community

organization that connects people, nature and the arts. Part of the Consortium's nature reserve was overgrown with an invasive plant species and the organization did not have the resources to adequately remove it. The 55-member Praxair team worked in the Consortium's reserve, removing the invasive plant and installing native plants, mulching and removing trash.

Making our Planet More Productive by engaging our employees through learning about the importance of environmental stewardship and performing a needed service for a local conservation group.

"As a new Praxair employee, I did not realize the commitment that the company had to improving the communities surrounding our offices and facilities. Being able to participate in projects such as the one involving the Nature Consortium not only gave me the opportunity to improve the environment but it created a stronger sense of community among my fellow Praxair employees. Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

Homelessness and the threat of homelessness are often tied to a lack of job skills and limited opportunities for critical skills development. Job training and emergency resources are necessary to help provide the skills people need to succeed and combat homelessness.

The Response

Praxair interns at the Sierra Pines office in Texas worked closely with the Montgomery County Emergency Association (MCEA), an organization that provides emergency assistance and job skills training to those in need. The MCEA hosts an annual "duck race" fundraiser. For a \$1 donation, participants adopt a rubber duck, which is then dropped, with all other adopted

ducks, down a two-story waterslide into a pool. Approximately 10,000 ducks "swim" toward a finish line at the opposite end of the pool. Participants win prizes based on how their duck finishes. The Sierra Pines interns organized several events to sell ducks prior to the race, raising \$4,200 for the cause. These funds were used to support MCEA programs and to provide emergency assistance to families on the verge of homelessness.

Project Focus: Diversity

The Need

In Mexico, opportunities for people with disabilities to engage in sporting activities, especially running, are not commonly available due to a lack of events and safe sporting environments.

The Response

Praxair Mexico employees in Saltillo, Coahuila, organized a 6K race to benefit three local associations that promote sports activities for people with disabilities. About 300 runners, including those with disabilities, Praxair employees and their families, customers and suppliers participated in the event. Leonardo de Jesus Perez, a London 2012 Paralympic medalist, was a special guest and addressed the runners with an inspiring speech before the start of the event.

Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

Drug trafficking and violence are prevalent in the Morro de Juramento community in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Many of the children have poor literacy skills and spend their afterschool hours on the streets, where they are susceptible to criminal influences.

The Response

The Recriar project is a partnership between White Martins employees, local businesses and community members to educate atrisk youth and to instill in them ethical, moral and social values. The Recriar project specifically helps these students avoid negative influences while strengthening their educational skills so that they can rise above their economic situation. The project began as a Christmas outreach program to

children living in an at-risk neighborhood near a White Martins plant. Each holiday season, the children received a complete set of clothing and a toy. In 2011, a White Martins employee noticed that some of the children and teens receiving gifts were carrying weapons or working for drug dealers. So in 2012, White Martins expanded the program to include daily after-school tutoring for the children and weekly contributions of groceries for their families. Approximately 200 children and their families have benefitted from the program.

Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

The cost of necessary housing repairs is a burden for many people facing multiple economic and health challenges.

The Response

For the past 11 years, Praxair Distribution, Inc.'s (PDI) Shared Services Center in Ankeny, Iowa, has worked with Rebuilding Together Greater Des Moines to renovate homes for Iow-income homeowners, particularly the elderly, disabled and families with dependent children. In 2013, the team refurbished a home for a disabled family whose son served in the Army. The volunteer team included several veterans, including PDI team lead Ryan Riggs, a former Marine. The team performed numerous electrical repairs, including the installation of energy-efficient lighting, a new

switchbox and fire and carbon monoxide detectors. The team also repaired the gutters, house siding, a window and the outside water spigot and patched the driveway. In recognition of the son's military service, the team also installed a new American flag on the home's deck. In addition, PDI employees collaborated with a local hotel chain to provide the family with a room free of charge while their home was being renovated.

Project Focus: Healthcare

The Need

Less than two percent of the Mexican population are blood donors and there is an increasing need for emergency blood supplies in local hospitals and health centers.

The Response

Praxair Mexico and Praxair Central America organized a blood donor campaign to benefit the National Blood Transfusion Center and the Mexican Red Cross. The campaign included sponsoring blood drives at Praxair sites or at nearby health centers, educating employees about the importance of and requirements for donating blood, and recognizing employees who chose to become donors. As a result, 220 employees gave blood last year.

Project Focus: Community Support

The Need

Many people living under the poverty level, including immigrants, the elderly and the homeless do not have sufficient access to shelter, medical services and job skills.

The Response

Community needs are very visible within Novara, Italy's population of 100,000, and Praxair Surface Technologies (PST) employees wanted to make a positive impact on this community. PST chose to work with Sister Nemesia's House, a shelter for those in need, which also provides medical services and job skills training to approximately 10,000 people each year, most of them women.
